Part 1:

- The application form basically keeps the associate director of academic programs from getting fired. It will act as proof that the department approved you to take these courses at the graduate level as an undergraduate.
- The form requires 1 letter of recommendation, which will need to be emailed directly to the current associate director of academic programs.
- Deadline is the 1 month before the beginning of the semester you want to start taking graduate level courses.

Part 2:

The semester you plan to graduate, you will apply to the graduate school: <u>http://bme.uh.edu/graduate/admissions</u>

- 3 letters of recommendation are required. You enter their emails into the system, and they receive a link where they can upload their letter.
- Deadline is 2/15 or 10/15 (depends on graduating semester)

Part 3 (first semester of graduate school, after you have already graduated with your BS):

After you are admitted to the program, you need to file a transfer petition (<u>http://bme.uh.edu/sites/bme/files/files/GPSP-Updated%20Petition%20102020.pdf</u>) You will select option 9 "Transfer Credit" and do a direct UH equivalency for the 2 graduate courses you took as an undergraduate. You will write, "BIOE 63XX" for both Catalog # option lines. It's redundant, but needed to get those credits from your undergraduate career to your graduate record.
